MINUTES

The President opened the meeting and told us how proud he was of all we'd achieved over the past year. It is great to see so many young players feeding through into the adult teams and then on through regional competitions as far as international matches. Many thanks to all the Umpires.

The Minutes from the prior AGM were accepted as a true record. This was proposed by Vince Banks and seconded by Gerrold Kuijpers.

The Treasurer reported that the club is in good shape financially having made a surplus again this year. Membership numbers are consistent. Whilst income is down a little this is no cause for concern and mostly reflects some new keepers kit in which we've invested. We have an excess in the bank which is being held for the warm-up area. It is proposed that the balance of this money should be transferred to KAS so that we can earn some interest and also to prevent it masking the true financial position of the club. If it is transferred it will be as a donation restricted for use on the warm-up area. There were several views expressed but, essentially, the club were concerned that we should retain sufficient working capital. It was agreed by unanimous vote that we should transfer, at the discretion of the committee, a reasonable balance to KAS for this purpose up to a pre-agreed maximum.

The Treasurer, further, updated the club on the fortunes of Kinross Astro (KAS). KAS made a surplus of £1k this year (in contrast to a £3k deficit last year due to COVID). The masters program have proven to be regular visitors to our pitch which has been welcome. We have an Investment manager who is dealing with the funds in KAS for the long term. We've lost £800 from the investments over the past year due to the war in Ukraine but they seem to be increasing subsequently. We remain c.10k ahead of target for a full carpet replacement in 2030. The Treasurer has, separately, been tasked to reassess whether our target remains appropriate given that the Chinese have recently entered the hockey carpet market and prices are falling. The investment strategy, whilst fairly aggressive just now, will become more passive as we approach 2030 and the need to draw down the funds.

The Mens Club Captain reported that the Men's 1st team are comfortably mid-table and thanked the coaches, youth coming through and umpires for their assistance. Congratulations are due to Locky on the recent arrival of his first child, Flora.

The Mens 2nd team Captain reported the challenges of having so many players from which to choose and the associated responsibility. No one expressed much sympathy. There have been many new players both to the sport and to the club which has been a delight. The M2s managed our usual mid-table mediocrity again this year.

The Ladies Club Captain reported that the Ladies 1st team has experienced the opposite of the M2s as they have had fairly low numbers this year and, consequently, have finished lower in the league than hoped.

The Ladies 2nd team were delighted with how well the younger players have improved and contributed to the matches. Many thanks were expressed to coaches, umpires and parents for driving hither and yon. There have been some pleasing additions to the Brave academy (Scotland Development) from the club

The Ladies Dev squad couldn't field a formal team due to lack of numbers but they've made a significant contribution further up the club.

The Kobras now have 92 kids aged 7 - 14 and have been able to push some up to the Dev squad. Many thanks to all the coaches, of which we require many due to the numbers, for all the assistance and time that they contribute. We've seen the return of Festivals and would hope to have one every fortnight through the summer. The Kobras have been very successful at these tournaments in all age groups. It is recognised that several of the coaches are likely to be following their children up to the Dev squad next year so we'll need a new squad for the younger kids.
